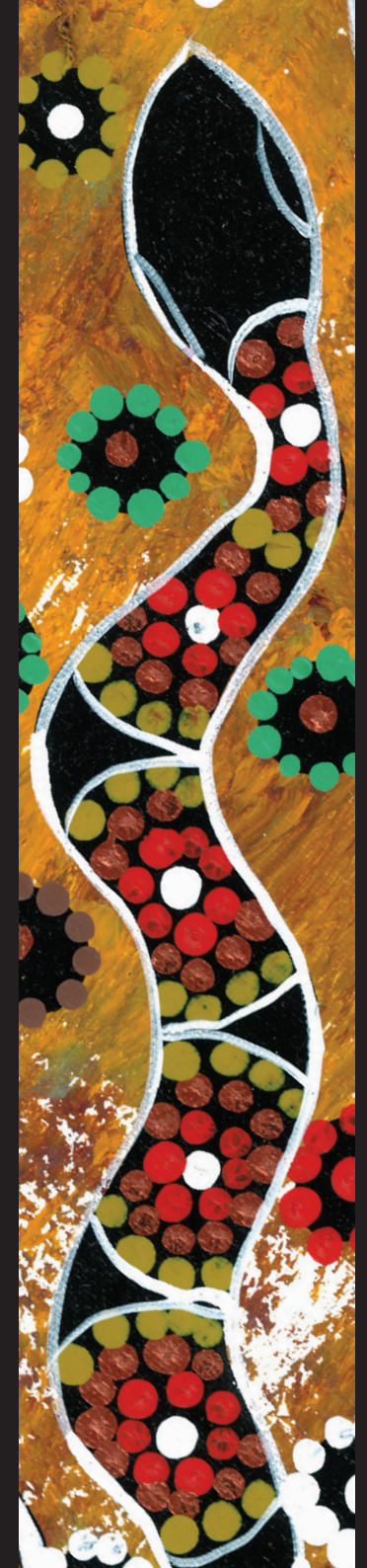




Perpetual Calendar for Reconciliation and Health

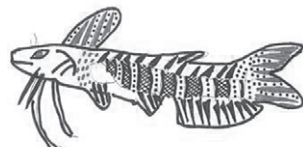
